GENERAL SHIPHANDLING SIMULATOR COURSE ACCREDITED BY MARITIME TRAINING COUNCIL

This course is designed for all experienced deck officers in charge of a navigational watch, including Masters and Maritime Pilots. The course essentially covers the most of the important principles and techniques on how to safely and efficiently handle a vessel in common situations.

COURSE AIMS: Upon completion of the course, participants should be able to gain comprehensive understanding and improved ability on how to effectively maintain control of a ship when maneuvering in open and confined waters, docking, undocking, anchoring, and in time of emergencies.

COVERAGE / PROGRAM FOCUS: The course provides shiphandling lessons and numerous practical exercises utilizing different ship models focusing on:

- performing various maneuvers in open and confined waters, including narrow channels and rivers
- exercises with use of main engines, thrusters and tugs
- obtaining original data for turning circles, crash stop, and man overboard recovery
- docking and undocking maneuvers, anchoring, and picking up pilots

METHOD: Instructions and practical individual training are handled by experienced seagoing Master Mariners with the aid of the latest model of full mission bridge simulators.

COURSE INTAKE: Six (6) trainees can be accommodated in a training session. However, the number of participants during the conduct of simulator exercises should be limited to 3 trainees to allow a real life interaction at the bridge. Thus, a grouping scheme shall be implemented in case course attendees exceed 3 candidates.

ENTRY REQUIREMENT / TARGET GROUP: Preferably experienced deck officers.

COURSE CERTIFICATE: A Certificate of Completion is given to each participant who satisfactorily fulfills the Course.
