- Norwegian Ship Control Legislations;
- Norwegian Acts and Regulations;
- Seaworthiness Act;
- Seaman's Act;
- General Civil and Penal Code;
- Maritime Code;
- Maritime Inquiry;
- Hours of Work Act;
- Port State Control;
- Protection and Environment Work;
- Ship's and Qualification Documents; and
- DNV Class Rules and Survey.

**METHOD:** The core of Instructions gives emphasis on providing general synopsis on relevant acts, rules and regulations. Practical examples from actual situations and conceptualized scenarios are used to a great extent as class discourse. Routines and courses of actions to be followed regarding accident prevention, maritime inquiry, dismissal of seafarers and immediate actions to be taken after fatal accidents such as collision, grounding and pollution are covered ensuring that adequate procedures are practiced.

**ENTRY REQUIREMENT / TARGET GROUP:** Entry to this course is open to all Management Level Deck and Engine Officers.
