



This course is designed for all deck officers. It deals with management in a highly operational situation onboard ship's bridges, thus, provide a comprehensive understanding of bridge safe watchkeeping principles, passage planning, and bridge team organization where sound BTM principles should be applied at all stages.

COURSE AIMS & OBJECTIVES: This course shall enable candidates to recognize and identify both their strengths and weaknesses measured against the learning objectives of each training activities and simulation exercises. This, in effect, shall enhance and improve their knowledge and skills in managing bridge team and operation. In particular, at the end of the course trainees should be able to:

- apply essential BRM techniques such as:
 - Communication and Briefings
 - Challenge and Response to break chain of errors
 - Use of authority and assertiveness in a team
- use bridge equipment and human resources effectively
- apply and comply with company-specific bridge procedures during simulation exercises
- understand the role of the pilot on the bridge
- apply collision avoidance
- safely navigate, embark/disembark pilot in pilotage waters
- anchor safely in confined/congested waters
- execute safely docking/undocking maneuvers
- apply emergency procedures during simulation exercises e.g. man-overboard, steering/engine failures, etc.

COVERAGE / PROGRAM FOCUS: *Preliminary lectures* briefly tackle essentials of the following BRM modules: *Attitude, Cultural Awareness, Communication & Briefings, Challenge & Response, and Workload*; followed by review of *company-specific* Bridge Procedures and lecture-discussion on Shiphandling Principles.

Simulation activities shall mainly deal with exercises/scenarios in relation to execution and achievement of above-mentioned objectives.

METHOD: Combination of lecture-presentation, discussions and simulation activities/exercises using Full Mission Bridge Simulator.

ENTRY REQUIREMENT / TARGET GROUP: Entry to the course is open to all deck officers. Companies intending to avail the course shall submit their respective Bridge Procedures and Vessel's Emergency Response Procedures.

COURSE CERTIFICATE: A Certificate of Completion is given to each participant who satisfactorily fulfills the Course.
